
Prayer for Those Who Have Died

Financial Comments/ Comentarios Financieros

THANK YOU, to all of you who made contributions to the parish last year. Special thanks to those parishioners who signed up for Electronic Funds Transfer. Continuity in cash flow helps in budgeting and planning for expenditures. For the second straight year we fell short of the budgeted income planned to meet expenses. We offset this shortfall by under running our budgeted expenses and reducing our operational reserves to less than three weeks of expenses. We are thankful for your continued generosity.

GRACIAS, a todos ustedes que hicieron contribuciones a la parroquia el año pasado. Especial agradecimiento a aquellos feligreses que se han inscrito para la transferencia electrónica de fondos. La continuidad del flujo de dinero ayuda en el presupuesto y planificación de los gastos. Por segundo año consecutivo nos caímos por debajo de los ingresos presupuestados para sufragar gastos. Para compensar este déficit que corre de bajo de nuestros gastos presupuestados y reducir nuestra operativa se reservan al menos tres semanas de gastos. Estamos agradecidos por su continua generosidad.

INCOME: Total revenue was \$13,686 below budget projections. Shortfalls were in Sunday collections (\$6,025) Holy Day collections (\$6,604) and Faith Formation Youth (\$6,040) were the major contributors in not meeting income projections. These shortfalls were somewhat offset by increases in the Annual Catholic Appeal (\$3,348), Business & Other Revenue (\$2,467) and Faith Formation Adult (\$1,585). The remaining accounts were positive by \$908.

INGRESOS: El total de ingresos fue de \$13,686 debajo de las proyecciones del presupuesto. El déficit fue en colecciones dominicales (\$6.025), las colectas de días Festivos/Santos (\$6,604) y en la formación de jóvenes (\$6,040) estas fueron las principales contribuyentes por lo cual no se cumplieron las proyecciones de ingresos. Estas deficiencias fueron algo compensadas por aumentos en la Apelación Católica Anual (\$3,348), negocio & otros ingresos (\$2,467) y formación de fe adulta (\$1,585). Las cuentas restantes fueron positivas por \$908.

EXPENSES: Expenses were \$3,519 below budget projections. Salaries, Benefits, and Training were the major expenses under run (\$23,285) due to lower than expected salary expense and associated benefits. Faith Formation Youth was another expense under run (\$6,059) .However, Facilities, Contracts, & Utilities were expense over runs (\$23, 387) due to the major electrical repairs in the Rectory that could no longer be deferred. Also there was major moss removal and gutter repair on the Church. Tithing again, as in the past decade, was below what we had hoped to give to the needs of the community.

GASTOS: Los gastos fueron \$3,519 debajo del presupuesto. Salarios, beneficios y capacitación fueron los principales gastos en funcionamiento corrieron por debajo del ingreso (\$23,285) debido al menor gasto de salario esperado y seguro de vida. La Formación de jóvenes fue otro gasto en funcionamiento que corrió por debajo de lo presupuestado (\$6,059). Sin embargo, instalaciones, contratos y servicios públicos fueron gastos en los que se corrió por encima del presupuesto (\$23,387) debido a las reparaciones eléctricas que tuvieron que llevarse acabo, principalmente en la rectoría algo que ya no podría ser aplazado. También hubo un importante removimiento de musgo y reparación del canal de la iglesia. El Diezmo de nuevo, como en la última década, estuvo por debajo de lo que esperábamos para ayudar a las necesidades de la comunidad.

WORSHIP SPACE DEBT ELIMINATION: We paid \$34,087 for Worship Space debt elimination. We have \$115,000 remaining to be paid on the debt.

CLOSING COMMENTS: This fiscal year will present difficult financial challenges for St Theresa. We expect our expenditures to grow by nearly 6%. Therefore we need a corresponding increase in revenue. We have held our revenue projections steady for the last four years, but now we need to increase them to cover growth in insurance, taxes, infrastructure maintenance, and personnel costs. The continued and consistent generosity of our parishioners will help us meet these challenges. Thank you for all that you do.

COMENTARIOS DE CIERRE: Este año fiscal presentará desafíos financieros para Santa Teresa. Estamos expectativos a que nuestros gastos crecerán casi a u 6%. Por lo tanto tenemos un correspondiente aumento en los ingresos. Hemos tenido nuestras proyecciones de ingresos constantes durante los últimos cuatro años, pero ahora tenemos que aumentar para cubrir el crecimiento en seguros, impuestos, mantenimiento de infraestructura y gastos de personal. La generosidad continua y coherente de nuestros feligreses nos ayudará a enfrentar estos desafíos.

Faith Formation-Children, Youth and Adults

In our Faith Formation programs at St. Theresa's, we seek to invite all into a personal and communal relationship with God by engaging in ongoing education, celebrating the sacraments, building community, and connecting our faith at church to our lives beyond the parish walls. No matter our age, we are all called to lifelong learning and growth and to approach the mysteries of our faith with the natural openness and humility of children, for as Jesus says, "let the little children come to Me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these" (Matthew 19:14).

Children's Faith Formation:

In the children's faith formation program, we provide a mix of core faith formation curriculum taught in the classroom by our team of catechists along with communal activities such as engaging in the Rosary and Stations of the Cross together and the Advent and Lenten rallies which help us to prepare ourselves to enter into the liturgical seasons. We also held singing sessions, praising God and praying "twice" as Augustine would say!

In our sacramental preparation program for children, students prepared to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. We had 29 students who received these sacraments in the English program. Two children were also baptized and came into the Catholic Church through the RCIA for Children process.

We've started a Passport Faith Adventure Program which provides whole family catechesis and an opportunity for students to connect their faith

at church to their lives outside of the parish by participating in a variety of faith-filled field trips. This year we held a campfire sing-along, an outing to a local community garden where we practiced principles of Pope Francis' *Laudato Si* encyclical by learning about caring for the environment and helping to grow food that feeds vulnerable members in our community, as well as a trip out to Small Blessings Farm where we were able to learn about topics such as how sheep are raised and cared for while comparing this to how Jesus cares for us!

Adult Faith Formation:

This was an exciting year in adult faith formation! During the fall, we held a series of sessions on Carmelite spirituality that were presented by guest speakers from throughout the region. Additionally, we began Just Faith's Good News People program, a small group program that brings people together to learn, pray, discuss, and act on our calling to be good news in the world. There were also several opportunities for contemplative prayer during the season of Advent and Lent, providing a quiet time and place to be with God in this listening form of prayer. This year, we also had the privilege of accompanying several adults on their journey through the RCIA and confirmation process.

Ministry and faith formation simply cannot happen without the help of dedicated volunteers. I would like to extend a huge thank-you to all of those who have served as catechists, RCIA team members, adult faith formation organizers, and in numerous other roles. You have truly been a tremendous gift to our St. Theresa's community!

Youth Ministry:

St. Theresa's has a long tradition of empowering the youth of the parish to be servant leaders in our families, our parish, our schools, and our community at large. This year we kept to that tradition. Our Edge ministry (middle school), and our Life Teen ministry (high school) served in a wide variety of ministries throughout the parish.

Service to Parish and Community:

Every Sunday at 5 p.m. Mass our Life Teen Band, led the congregation in worship. At the Nativity House in Tacoma, we prepared and served lunch for low-income and homeless members of the community once a month. During Advent our youth worked with the St. Vincent de Paul Society to prepare food baskets for families in need, and during Lent our youth volunteered as servers for the Knights of Columbus Fish and Fries Friday's. The youth also prepared and performed the Passion play on Good Friday.

During the summer the Edge and Life Teen students from our Parish together with St. Louise Parish participated in the Agape mission trip, which serves the migrant community of the Bellingham area. The trip ran from June 25-30. Both of the groups worked in collecting, setting up and organizing food for the migrant food bank. They also ran games and activities with the children fr the children at migrant work camps.

Faith Formation-Children, Youth and Adults

Spiritual Enrichment:

Energy from our summer mission trip guided us towards deeper understanding of Christ's love for us. We were challenged to spread the good news of Jesus Christ to all members of the community through prayer, love and actions.

In November our Life Teen ministry combined with those of St. Louise and Holy Disciples Parishes attended the annual Catholic Youth Convention held at Puyallup Fairgrounds. The weekend was filled with great moments of prayer, fellowship, praise and worship, experiencing the amazing CYC experience.

Retreats:

Our Edge, Life Teen and Confirmation ministries each participated in a retreat at Camp Don Bosco, located in Carnation, WA. The theme of the Edge retreat was "Be Not Afraid." throughout the retreat participants gathered in the name of the carnation of the Edge retreat was "Be Not Afraid."

Confirmation ministry had 3 candidates this year for the Sacramental preparation. They attended their Confirmation retreat at Camp Don Bosco, were they discussed how we are all made in image and likeness of God, and how we are all called to follow Jesus' footsteps. Everything came together at our annual Life Teen retreat, as the youth and core members sought a deeper relationship with our Lord. With every lesson, every song, every prayer, and every activity the youth not only grew more as a family, but truly began to see the face of Christ in one another.

Confirmation:

In April Archbishop Sartain celebrated the Sacrament of confirmation in our Parish, for 3 youth and 4 adults in our community. This group of teens were faced every challenge, doubt, question, experience, and answered with maturity and a longing for truth and belonging. They grew as a family, and felt more called than ever to serve their brothers and sisters in the community.

The blessings of this year could not have been possible without the love, support, and dedication of all the staff, parents, core ministers who made of the events a possibility. Every Edge, every Life Night, every retreat, and every service project was made stronger thanks to everyone's participation, support and love for our youth.

CHILDREN FAITH FORMATION:

The Family is the primary environment where faith is shared and nurtured in our children. The community at our Parish is the one that provides the support for the families to form our young Catholics. making the goal of our Faith Formation Program: to have active learners as the basis of an active faith. This year 114 children between Kindergarten and Fifth grade where involved in the program and had the opportunity to live their faith, with their families and friends, throughout various activities like:


- Core curriculum according to the grade.
- The Floral procession on the feast of our Patron Saint.
- The feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, were the children participated in singing, dancing with the Quetzal Dance Group, bringing flowers, and acting in the apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe.
- Floral procession and rosary for Mary's Crowning Day.
- Advent & Lenten Rallies.
- During Advent the children also participated in the Posada*, were they together with their families sang, reflected and prayed about the birth of Baby Jesus. In this event they were also presented with a play by the adults on the Nativity of Jesus.
- During Lent: Children and their families prayed and reflected on the death and passion of Christ, by attending the Stations of the Cross.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

In our Sacramental preparation program, we give parents, children as well as adults receiving Sacraments, the knowledge on the reception of each of this. For the Sacrament of Baptism this fiscal vear we had 28th children between the ages of 0-6 baptized at our Parish. This year First Reconciliation was celebrated on February 25th, having 44 children receiving this sacrament, that led to getting them one step closer to receiving 1st Communion. On June 24th First Communion was celebrated in June 24th, in which 42 children received this Sacrament. We also had 6 adults attend our RCIA program this year, 2 of them receiving all sacraments, 4 of the receiving First Communion during the Holy Saturday Vigil 2017.



REACH OUT

It is the mission of Reach Out to provide shelter and support services to adults without homes in South King County to help them attain stable housing and living conditions.

Reach Out partners with local churches to shelter men and women in the Federal Way/Northeast Tacoma area from October -March. St. Theresa's provided four weeks of meals, and over 25 different parish families prepared and served hot dinners at the shelters. In addition, 18 parishioners welcomed the women as hosts at the women's shelter. Site and case management is provided by Catholic Community Services.

During the season, Reach Out sheltered 76 men and 44 women. Of these, 14 men and 4 women found stable housing, and 16 men and 5 women attained jobs.



Reach Out is financially supported by members of St. Theresa's in a variety of ways. Many of our parishioners attend and make donations at the annual Pay It Forward Breakfast, the Knights of Columbus gave money for new sweatshirts for the men at Christmas, and the budget committee gave money to provide breakfast and lunch items at the shelters during the weeks our parishioners provided hot dinners.

SANDWICH MIISTRY 2017

Thanks to the dedication of 80 households from our parish, about 16,000 sandwiches were made and delivered to hungry and homeless people in Tacoma this past year. Not only do our sandwiches help fill their stomachs, but they feed their hearts as well - knowing that others care about their well being.

According to a pre-determined schedule, each member of this ministry makes about 20 sandwiches once a month and brings them to the church kitchen wrapped and labeled. We have a few dedicated "delivery men" who bring the sandwiches to Tacoma's Guadalupe House twice a week. A member of the "Keep 'em Warm, Keep 'em Fed" program brings those sandwiches directly to the streets of Tacoma, where our hungry neighbors receive these gifts that are made with love by our volunteers. The number of people in need continues to grow and more sandwiches are needed to help keep them fed. DESIGNS FOR LIFE:

GRIEF MINISTRY:

From July 2016 through June 2017. The grief committee has served at 6 funerals. The volunteers have provided the salads and desserts for the receptions following the funeral as well as purchased meat and cheese trays, breads and punch ingredients. We set the tables and the buffet up. We have about twenty-five volunteers that we can call on. Most of the volunteers are seniors although we do have a few ladies that drop off food on their way to work. We also have some Knights of Columbus members that are available on occasion. Volunteers are always welcome.

FUSION

FUSION – Friends, United to Shelter the Indigent, Oppressed, and Needy, continues to operate as an all-volunteer non-profit that provides transitional housing and support services to homeless families, particularly women and their children. We maintain and manage 19 fully-furnished homes and contract case management services through Catholic Community Services.

This past year, FUSION provided fully-furnished homes with support services to 22 families consisting of 79 individuals. This total comprises 32 adults, 47 children (40% of children were between the ages of 6-12). Seven families exited our transitional housing program and moved on to permanent, stable housing. The average length of stay was 17 months per family. Eighty-six percent of the families served successfully moved to a stable, permanent home.

In 2017, FUSION purchased a commercial building in downtown Federal Way to house the FUSION Décor Boutique. The upscale, resale store sells gently used furniture, décor, antiques, and collectibles. Proceeds from the sale of donated merchandise are invested in the housing program. The new business address is: 1108 S. 322nd PI., Federal Way, WA 98003. Over 200 volunteers work throughout the year to manage our homes, raise funds, work in the boutique, collect donations, or prepare for the annual art fund-raiser. HOMEBOUND MINISTRY:

"Suffering wears a thousand faces, and every face is Christ's" is the opening sentence of the Catholic Handbook for visiting the sick and homebound.

One of the deepest causes of suffering by those whom sickness or aging confines to the narrow world of home, hospital, or geriatric facility is the sense of isolation. Often this is followed by feelings of being misunderstood, not heard, not valued or useful, or embarrassed.

Eucharistic ministers have the honor to bring the love of Christ to our neighbors who are suffering both physically and emotionally as we offer them the greatest gift one can offer, Christ himself in the form of Holy Communion.

Testimonies of many of those ministered to report that the visits of St. Theresa's Eucharistic ministers are the highlight of their week. We currently have fourteen active ministers serving three Federal Way care institutions

Those of us at St. Theresa's Parish who are honored to work in this ministry report that following each visit we ourselves receive a sense of God's peace and joy. We are the beneficiaries'. To journey with another in their time of sickness and sometimes death is sacred and is often life-changing to the minister.

Last year the Society received about 700 requests for assistance from families or individual in crisis. About 500 of these callers qualified for assistance. Of these 270 families required financial assistance (utility, motel and rent) and the other 230 families received food, food vouchers, gas vouchers, bus tickets or Orca cards and clothing. All appreciated a home visit and the comfort and hope that comes from someone coming to see them, listen to them and pray with them.

The Society held four "Clean Your Closet" Sunday clothing drives during the year and was very pleased by the response. We collected more than 150 large leaf bags of clothing each time the drive was held. Your combined donations helped



generate funds through resale at our St. Vincent de Paul thrift stores. Profits from the sales serve to fund programs that help the poor.

On the Saturday before Christmas in 2016, the Society delivered 110 Christmas food baskets to the neediest families with children that our records showed we had helped during the year. We were pleased to include in the Christmas delivery at least two gifts for each child in the family. More than 322 children received these gifts. The deliveries by volunteers from the parish were a bright spot in each household's holiday celebration.

Recently one of our Vincentians traveled to Spain on a pilgrimage to walk the CAMINO DE SANTIAGO.

He reported it as an amazing experience. He stated that:" the Camino Pilgrimage gave me an opportunity to reflect on my Vincentian vocation, to follow Christ through service to

During those long peaceful walks in my Camino journey, a goal I had set for myself 5 years ago, I was able to spend time reflecting on some of my own spiritual goals – how to give priority to the poorest of the poor and to those who are most rejected by society. Perhaps you too will want to join people from all walks of life walking on the CAMINO DE SANTIAGO. I can assure you that you will never be the same!"

Through this event we provide transportation to the annual Mass & March for Life and Catholic Advocacy Day events held annually in Olympia, WA. We attend and work the 4US Family Event in August with a number of our Hispanic brothers. This event raises money for ultrasound machines for pregnancy resource centers. This year, in the spirit of fraternalism with our Chaplin Father Jean Pierre Kasonga, we raised awareness both locally and at the state level of the dire situation of the people in Father's homeland, the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Toward this end, we initiated a program of prayer and potential plans for political action in an effort to bring peace.

YOUTH

Our Youth Director is Joe Bazzetta. We hosted our six annual Friday Lenten dinners (Fish Fry's) with the help of our parish youth which raised money for their summer mission trip. We also hosted the annual soccer challenge and the Easter egg hunt.
